BEIJING: Chinese authorities detained 21 Japanese nationals in Chongqing on Friday. As reported by the South China Morning Post, the detained Japanese are said to be part of a Christian group and might have been targeted as part of the Chinese crackdown on Christian missionaries which is labeled as illegal in Beijing.

China orders crackdown on outdoor religious statues

BEIJING: China's ruling Communist Party has ordered the provincial governments to regulate construction of large outdoor religious statues in a bid to prevent "commercialisation" of Buddhist and Taoist religions, official media reported on Saturday.

Man arrested after driver rams into three on Oregon sidewalk

PORTLAND (US): A driver ramed into three women walking on a sidewalk in downtown Portland, critically injuring one of them, before speeding away and getting arrested within hours of the crash, authorities said.

Trump strikes deal with Xi over sanctions imposed on ZTE

WASHINGTON DC (UNITED STATES): US President Donald Trump on Friday said that he has struck a deal with Chinese Pres Xi Jinping to ease the United States sanctions imposed on Chinese telecommunications company ZTE.

28,000 South Africans scammed in fake investment scheme

JOHANNESBURG: More than 28,000 people have been defrauded of a total of over \$83 million with promise of higher interests in South Africa, police said, as they are investigating the case.

9 dead in Brazil juvenile jail riot after mattress gets torched

RIO DE JANEIRO: Nine juvenile detainees died on Saturday during a fire that started when inmates lit a mattress during a riot, authorities said. The facility, located in the city of Goiania, is used to temporarily hold minors between the ages of 13 and 17.

No Russian support for Catalonia's independence drive: Putin

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin denied on Friday that his country has supported the independence drive of the northeastern Spanish region of Catalonia, saying he wants the Iberian nation to preserve its territorial integrity.

Russian police arrest man who vandalised Ivan the Terrible painting

MOSCOW: Russian police on Saturday said they arrested a man for vandalising one of the best known works of 19th century painter Ilya Repin, depicting Ivan the Terrible killing his son, at a gallery in Moscow.

21 killed, 1.5 lakh hit by rains in Sri Lanka

COLOMBO: At least 21 people have died and two were missing due to rains and winds in Sri Lanka, as bad weather hit more than 150,000 across the country over a week, the government said on Saturday.

North and South Koreans leaders meet inside DMZ

South Korea said President Moon Jae-in met with North Korea's leader Kim Jong Un on Saturday inside the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) dividing the two nations, a day after US President Donald Trump said his summit with Pyongyang could still go ahead.

S Korea hails prospect of reignited US-North Korea talks

Seoul: South Korea on Saturday welcomed the renewed prospect of a summit between the United States and North Korea after President Trump cancelled talks with Kim Jong Un only to suggest they might still take place.

The North Korea-US talks are reignited. We are watching developments carefully. Presidential Blue House spokesman Kim Eui-gyong said. Trump's cancellation of the summit blindsided treaty ally South Korea, which had brokered the remarkable detente between Washington and Pyongyang after months of Kim and Trump trading insults and threats of war.

US warns Syria of 'firm' action over Southern offensive

The US has warned Damascus it will take "firm" action if the regime of Bashar al-Assad violates a ceasefire deal, after Syrian aircraft dropped missiles on a southern province, according to an expected offensive.

Residents of Daraa told AFP on Friday that several different leaders were scattered across the province, which has borders with Israel and Jordan and is expected to be among the next targets in the resurgent regime's reconquest. One of them, seen by a journalist contributing to AFP in the city of Daraa, includes a picture showing lined up bodies, presumably of anti-government fighters.

Ireland's pro-life campaign concedes defeat in abortion referendum

DUBLIN: Thousands of people in Ireland are celebrating after the country voted overwhelmingly to change the constitution so that abortion can be legalised.

The Friday vote saw citizens effectively opt to either retain or repeal the Eighth Amendment of the country's Constitution, which prohibits terminations unless a mother's life is in danger.

The Save The 8th campaign has conceded defeat in the country's historic abortion referendum after exit polls reported a landslide win for those advocating liberalisation.

The Save The 8th group said: "What Irish voters did yesterday is a tragedy of its own proportions. However, a wrong does not become right simply because a majority support it."

The official vote count later today will be a moment of profound change in Ireland's social history, a moment when the nation collectively stood up for women and for their healthcare, and voted for constitutional change.

Musharraf suggests exchanging Dr Afridi for TTP chief with US

Pakistan's former dictator Pervez Musharraf has said that he would have released imprisoned Dr Shakil Afridi, who helped CIA track down Osama bin Laden in 2011, in exchange for TTP chief Mullah Fazlullah in a "give and take" deal with the US had he been the president.



Afridi was arrested after Laden was killed in a covert US raid at a compound in Pakistan's Abbottabad city on May 2, 2011. The US has been asking Pakistan to release him, Dawn reported from Washington that Musharraf, 74, in an interview to Voice of America's Greta Van Susteren said that relations between the US and Pakistan were at their "lowest ebb" now.

Powerful cyclone hits Oman, Yemen

Yemenis, Indians and Sudanese were among those missing on the Arabian Sea isle. Officials said 3 people are dead and 40 missing

Cyclone Mekunu blew into the Arabian Peninsula early on Saturday drenching arid Oman and Yemen, cutting off power lines and leaving at least three dead and 40 missing, officials said.

Portions of Salalah, Oman's third-largest city, lost electricity as the cyclone made landfall. The Arabian Sea churned Saturday morning, sending mounds of sea foam into the air. The waves ate into one tourist beach, pulling hunks of it away and toppling thatch umbrellas cemented into the sand.

As Mekunu barreled overhead, the eye of the storm provided a moment's respite. At one luxury hotel, which already had evacuated its guests, workers sat down early for a traditional "shoor": a meal Muslims eat before sunrise during the holy fasting month of Ramadan.

TECH GIANTS

Google and Facebook face fines of up to \$9.3 bn as US news sites go unavailable

Within hours of the European Union's (EU) General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) taking effect on Friday, technology giants Google and Facebook have been hit with privacy complaints that could carry fines of up to \$9.3 billion in total, media reported.

With regard to privacy, Google, Facebook and Facebook-owned WhatsApp and Instagram are forcing people to adopt a "take it or leave it" approach which essentially amounts to demanding that users submit to intrusive terms of service, according to the Australian privacy advocacy group Noyb.eu. CNET reported on Friday.
